This week's learning

In Maths we looked at subtraction, including counting backwards on a number line and using the column method. We found exchanging 10s for 1s quite tricky! 



Ideas to help practise your spellings


Look, Cover, Write & Check

Try to write all your spellings with the opposite hand you write with.




Vowel Void
