Equip children with the knowledge and skills to experiment, invent and create their own works of art.

Encourage children to think critically and make links between different forms of art using subject specific language.

Provide opportunities for children to learn about artists who are experts in their field and local artists.

Promote a love for art through engaging lessons and develop their understanding of its values in regards to history, culture and creativity.

Support access to learning through differentiation and an inclusive approach.

Give children the language they need to appraise and appreciate art.

Create opportunities for children to showcase their work and develop a sense of pride in what they have achieved.

Sketchbooks

Every child at Brunswick house is provided with a sketchbook in which they can experiment, invent and develop their own ideas. These sketchbooks stay with the children throughout their journey at Brunswick House as a way to see progression skills.

Key Vocabulary

Lessons include key words, building a rich vocabulary to develop understanding, appropriate for the age and stage of the child. Front sheets are used to present the skills and key vocabulary at the start of each project. This enables teachers to use the skills planned for and to use the language of the subject in their lessons.

Meaningful and memorable experiences

Teaching and learning plans for practical investigative opportunities within art lessons. Children will reflect on previous learning and cross curricular links will be made wherever possible
