

# **School Uniform Policy**

#### Introduction

It is the responsibility of our governing body to decide the following:

- rules around appearance
- whether there should be a school uniform policy and if so, what that should be
- how the uniform should be sourced

These duties are placed upon all governing boards by statute to ensure that this policy promotes good behaviour and discipline amongst the pupil body.

The DfE strongly encourages schools to have a uniform as it can play a key role in:

- promoting the ethos of a school
- providing a sense of belonging and identity
- setting an appropriate tone for education
- safeguarding children in the community.

We strongly support the DfE philosophy that school uniform and dress codes play a valuable role in contributing to the ethos of the school and in setting an appropriate school identity. It is also important to recognise that it should comply with the Human Rights Act 1998 and Equality Act 2010.

The School Uniform and Dress Code can:

- instil a sense of pride
- support positive behaviour and discipline
- encourage identity with, and support for, the school ethos
- ensure pupils of all backgrounds feel welcome
- protect pupils from social pressure to dress in a particular way
- nurture cohesion and promote good relations between different groups of pupils.

## **SECOND HAND UNIFORM:**

The school actively encourages parents to send in previously worn uniform items in good condition into the school. The school will put out these second hand uniform items after school to all families on a regular basis. All items will be free of charge.

### **JEWELLERY:**

- Children should not wear jewellery to school. •
- A wristwatch is acceptable, but we do not accept responsibility for its loss or damage.
- Rings, bracelets, necklaces and earrings other than plain studs are not permitted. •
- Studs may be worn but they must be removed for PE and games by the children themselves. • (Parents of our youngest children often take them out before the children come to school).

### HAIR:

- Hair should be clean and tidy. •
- It must not be dyed, excessively styled or shaved with pictures/patterns or symbols. •
- Long hair should be tied back neatly with discreet fastenings in school colours where available.

### NAILS:

- Please keep children's finger nails clipped short. •
- Finger nails should not be painted with nail varnish. •
