
Transition



Reading in Year 1

- Each child has a reading record folder with an allocated day to return their books to school.
- Children read weekly with the teacher and with the TA.
- Please ensure books are returned so that they can be used for other groups.
- Your child will bring one phonics based book which is decodable. They can also choose one book from the class library which you can read with them or read to them, promoting reading for enjoyment!
- Please make a comment in your child's book when you read together at home.



Twinkl Phonics at Brunswick House



- Our carefully selected phonics scheme is Twinkl Phonics
- This scheme is supported by a variety of reading books which will help your child build fluency and develop a love of reading!
- Children will practise with Rhino Readers, Bug Club books and Twinkl minibooks that match their phonics level.



Level 5

Level 5 is taught in Year 1.

By the end of Level 5, children will have had the opportunities to:



- give the phoneme, when shown any grapheme that has been taught;
- for any given phoneme, write the common graphemes;
- read automatically all taught tricky and common exception words;
- accurately spell all the Level 2, 3 and 4 tricky words and most of the common exception words for reading;
- apply phonics knowledge and skills as the primary approach to reading and spelling unfamiliar words that are not completely decodable:
- read and spell phonically decodable twosyllable and three-syllable words such as 'dolphin' and 'parachute';
- form each letter correctly;
- use alternative ways of pronouncing and representing the long vowel phonemes.

Year 1 Phonics Check

- We teach phonics daily.
- In June there will be a Phonics check, where your child will read words to a teacher using the sounds they have learnt.
- This is to check your child's ability to decode words in order to progress in reading.
- If your child is finding phonics and decoding difficult, your child will be given extra support and interventions at school.

Online Safety

- Threaded through our curriculum topics
- Discuss e-Safety at home
- Know the risks
- Know what should be kept private

- Use parental control functions but these will not guarantee 100% blockage of inappropriate material.
- Have an open communication of what's going on on-line try to avoid a secretive culture
- Banning the internet or websites do not work. It can make a child feel less able to report a problem or concern. However, we do advise you follow the age guidelines for specific apps and games
