

Reading

We do five reading sessions as a class.

We encourage pupils to read for pleasure as often as possible and complete book reviews when they finish a book.

We expect children to read for at least 20 minutes a day at home. We ask that parents read aloud with children at least three times a week using the VIPERS style questions that are stuck into the reading records.

Children are invited to change their books once a week. Their book changing day will be written on their reading record.

Please ensure reading records are in school everyday.

Writing

We focus on a range of different text genres throughout the year.

These will be broken down based upon the book that we are using as a stimuli for study per term.

The children will complete a big write once every two weeks, which will then be edited, improved and written into a final draft.

Writing will be marked, with suggestions for improvement to be made by the class teachers.

SPaG – Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

Alongside teaching reading and writing, we will also be delivering SPaG lessons.

Teaching and activities will build on the skills covered in previous year groups as well as new skills (See below)

Spelling

- We use the Spelling Shed Spelling scheme.
- We will be sending home spellings weekly via the newsletter.

Spelling groups

These spellings will be aimed at your child's spelling level and will come to you via the newsletter.

Spelling competitions take place on a Friday morning and the results are monitored. We encourage you to practise the spellings at home with your children.

Children will be expected to use the spellings covered in their independent writing.

PE kit

Online Safety

One of our computing curriculum topics

Discuss e-Safety at home

Know the risks

Know what should be kept private

Make sure you know what your child is doing online as you would in real-life

Ensure you know how your children's devices work and provide a safe environment to use these (no closed doors)

Use parental control functions – but these will not guarantee 100% blockage of inappropriate material.

Have an open communication of what's going on on-line – try to avoid a secretive culture

Banning the internet or websites do not work. It can make a child feel less able to report a problem or concern. However, we do advise you follow the age guidelines for specific apps and games

Class Dojo

Both classes will be using Class Dojo to support children's behaviour for learning and leave updates on the class stories. Please make sure that you are connected to Class Dojo.

We are unable to directly answer messages via Class Dojo but we will endeavour to reply within 48 hours (working days).

Home Learning

Home learning helps to consolidate and extend the children's learning from school.

Reading aloud with an adult at least three times a week at home but independently every other day!

Practice spelling patterns/focus – these are on the newsletter every week and will be tested on Friday. You can use Spelling Shed to practice your spellings through games and assignments.

Practice maths – Mathletics – aim for 2,000 points weekly. TT rockstars is also a good tool for practicing times tables recall.

Home learning activities will be added to the newsletter each week.
