There are 190 statutory days in one school year; this leaves 175 days every year out of school time available for holidays, visiting family, shopping and attending routine appointments, such as the doctors and dentist.

Every minute of every lesson of every day counts!

Your child's education is too important to take leave in term time.

We hope your child never has to miss a day of school. We do understand however that due to illness or emergency, this is sometimes unavoidable.

If your child is absent, you should report the absence using the Studybugs application, telephone or email the school every day that they are absent. This must be done *before 9am* and a reason for absence must be given.

Taking your child out of school means:

Attainment and progress are negatively impacted upon by missed time in school. GCSE and A - Level exam grades are reduced in proportion to the number of days missed.

Don't be late!


Registration is from 8.45am – 9.00am.

Any child who arrives between 9.01am and 9.15am will be marked as *late*.
