

## Brunswick House Primary School

### Primary Physical Education and Sports Premium

#### What is the sports premium?

The government has announced that the Sports premium will now continue until 2020, this funding provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport will be allocated to primary school head teachers and this money must be used to improve the provision of PE and School sport.

#### Purpose of the funding:

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. The funding should ensure:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - kick starting healthy active lifestyle.
- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school and is used as a tool for whole school improvement.
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- A broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- Increased participation in competitive sport.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- Hiring qualified coaches to work with teachers
- Providing existing staff with training and/or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively.
- Introducing new sports and activities to pupils.
- Supporting and involving the least active pupils in sporting clubs and activities.
- Running sports clubs.
- Increasing pupil participation in school games competitions
- Running sports competitions within school and with other schools.

#### Aims of the PE and School Sport Funding at Brunswick House Primary School:

PE and school sport play a very important part in the life of Brunswick House Primary School. We believe that PE and school sport contribute to the holistic development of

our children and through participation, our children build and learn more about our school values of respect, team work, empathy, self-belief and honesty.

**At Brunswick we aim to:**

- Provide increased opportunities for all children regardless of sporting ability.
- Increase opportunities to compete in competitive sport at all levels.
- Develop teachers skill set, ensuring all PE lessons are of the highest quality.
- Promote our school values through PE and Sport.

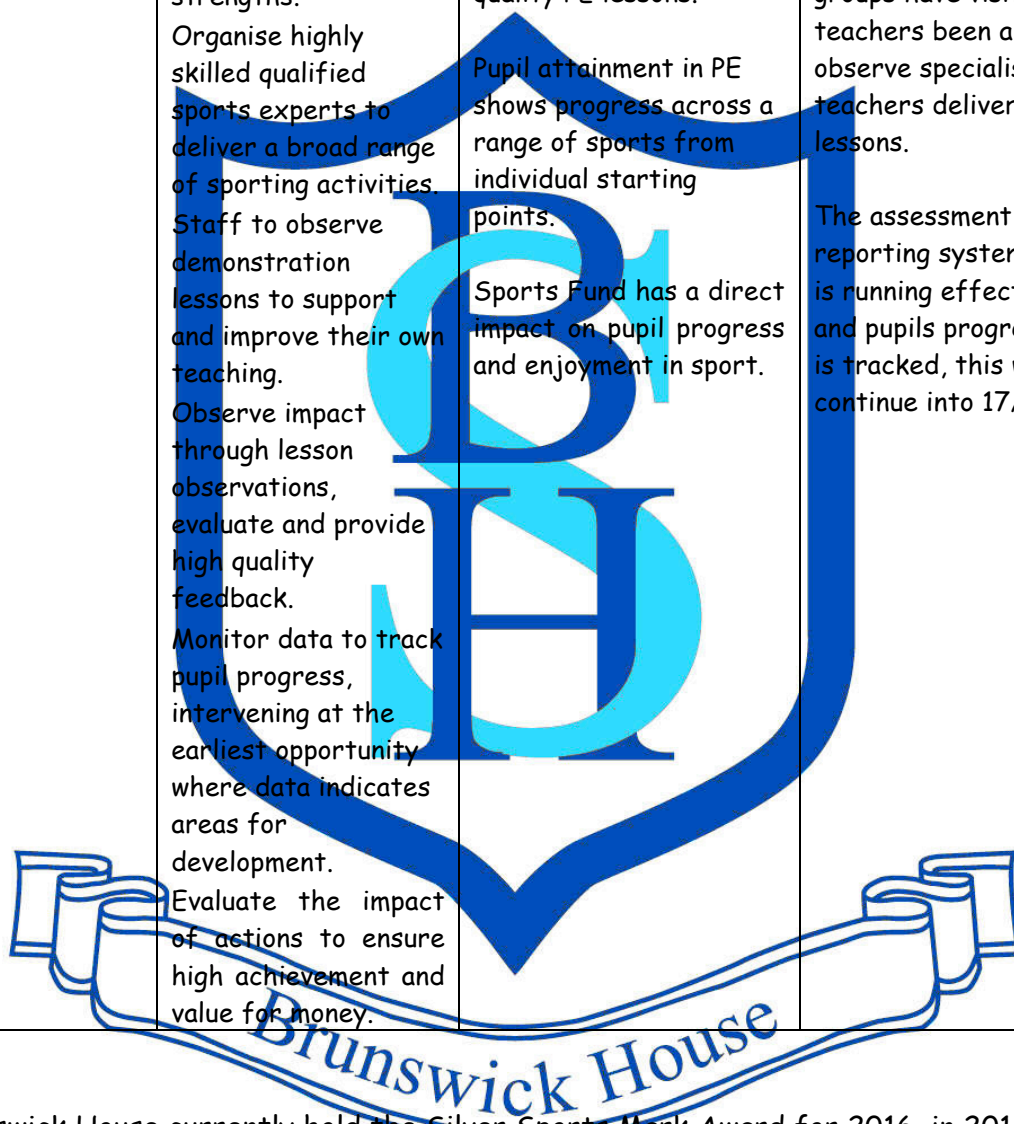

Provide the children with a democratic process through which pupils can apply and be voted for as values leaders. Deepen promotion of values scheme through lesson plans, school council and	Core values are embedded in the pupil's day to day school life.  Pupils understand the importance of these values and demonstrate them on a daily basis.  Progress in PE and core subjects is improved.  Pupils are happy and show enjoyment and confidence across all areas of Brunswick House.  Pupils will be ambassadors for sport and lead events and inter school competitions.	The pupils are aware of the values and these have been embedded within school life.  Each Friday pupils who demonstrate the qualities that these values hold receive medals, this will continue into the academic year 17/18.  Lanyards have been purchased for all staff and head boy/girl, these will continue to be used in 17/18.  Sports Ambassadors have been nominated and they are meeting twice a term. These meetings are run by a teaching assistant and feedback is given to the PE leader.

In the future the competition will take place in Key Stage 1 also.  The FA provides football coaching three times a week, parents pay for this club.  Links with local sports clubs have been made and are being built upon; next a wider range of sports will be looked at. The PE budget is able to pay for a number of coaches to come in.  The participation level in clubs has improved since 15/16, a greater percentage of girls now take part but this still needs to be a focus.
