Staff develop a deepened knowledge of how to deliver high quality PE to pupils in identified areas. Pupils receive high quality coaching to develop their skills in Tennis and Cricket. Pupils receive high quality PE lessons, scaffolded by expert tuition. Pupils broaden their knowledge of different sports resulting in increased participation in sports clubs in and out of school. Teachers are clear in the next steps in pupils' learning and pupils receive a curriculum that is specific to their abilities. Pupils make good progress term on term. Pupils are able to recall prior learning and apply this to new learning. Low level quizzes enable pupils to learn more, and recall knowledge about prior learning. Pupils broaden and enrich vocabulary and can use appropriate vocabulary to describe their learning.
